The Civil War Chapter 15 I The War Begins • Civil war broke out between the North and the South in 1861 A Following the outbreak of war at Fort Sumter, Americans chose sides • Seven southern states had seceded before Lincoln took office • Lincoln refused to recognize secession and tried desperately to save the Union • Confederate officials began seizing federal-mint branches
